Public Interest Technology University Network

Resources from the Public Interest Technology University Network (PIT-UN), a 63-member network growing the field of public interest technology (PIT). This SkillsCommons collection is reflection of a subset of projects funded since 2019 by the PIT-UN Challenge, a unique program that drives equitable innovation in technology across academia, government, industry and civil society. Since 2019, the Challenge has deployed over \$15 million to build new courses, research centers, community and government partnerships, certificates and degrees, internships, fellowships and other initiatives. Members of PIT-UN lead Network Challenge projects, often in partnership with other universities, community organizations, nonprofits, government offices or companies. The PIT-UN Challenge Fund is a fiscally sponsored project of New Venture Fund.

- Users suggest searches with “material type” to understand the variety of resources available
- Users suggest a search by “industry” to see how the resources align with PIT-UN field-building areas
